Code Enforcement Efforts

(Goal 13- Focus enforcement [including Neighborhood Preservation] activities on community priorities)

Illegal Signage

Neighborhood Preservation staff provided weekend coverage to address illegal signage. Last
weekend, staff responded to 33 open house visits. Additionally, staff removed 21
noncompliant business and garage sale signs. The number of non-compliant real estate
signs has been going down significantly as the industry gets familiar with Livermore's sign
ordinance.

Keeping Livermore Clean

Continuing to preserve the City's visual appeal, staff conducts weekly proactive
enforcement to identify and address violations in a timely manner. Staff addressed graffiti
on Stanley Boulevard at the Railroad sound wall and illegal dumping on North L Street and
on Northfront Road.

Human Services

(Goal 8- Expand and improve access to human services)

- The City of Livermore's Housing & Human Services Grant program proudly funds essential services supporting low-income residents, including families, veterans, and seniors. For FY24-25, \$928,157 was awarded to nine local agencies, providing rental assistance, healthcare, meals, shelter, and more. Highlights from the past quarter include:
 - 10 households receiving rental assistance and case management
 - 77 individuals accessing shelter services
 - o 1,958 clients accessing meals and food pantry services
 - 37 residents enrolled in healthcare

Downtown Development

L Street Parking Garage

 The contractor is re-shoring and building falsework and forming for both halves of the final Level 4 slab through November and early December. Both halves of Level 4 slab pour estimated to be completed by end of December. The projected estimated opening timeframe is summer 2025 and the percentage of work completed to date is 54.3%.

Advisory Body Updates

Human Services Commission

- On Nov. 12, Livermore hosted a Joint Human Services Commission meeting with Pleasanton and Dublin. The joint meeting focused on the Eastern Alameda County Human Services Needs Assessment (EACHSNA) goals in progress, which include moving to a two-year grant cycle, single grant application for all three cities, and simplified grant application.
- The Commissions also provided input to staff on the proposed near-term and long-term recommendations that meet the Eastern Alameda County Human Services Needs Assessment goals and non-profit priorities.

Planning Commission

 The 44-unit, single-family Garaventa Hills subdivision was unanimously recommended for approval on by Planning Commission on Nov. 12. The City Council will consider this project on Nov. 25. The project is located at the end of Bear Creek Drive just west of Laughlin Road.

Crime Reduction Strategies

Police Department staff attended a webinar, "A City's Guide to Leveraging CARE Court,"
hosted by the League of California Cities. The webinar provided updates on the status of
Community Assistance, Recovery and Empowerment (CARE) Court's statewide, the criteria
for individuals who qualify, the processes for treatment of individuals, and desired
outcomes. CARE Court in Alameda County is scheduled to open by the end of November
2024 and will be in Oakland. While collaborating with service providers, staff will be
monitoring local cases eligible for and referred to the CARE Court.


Veterans Day Recruitment




TOTAL NOISE CONCERNS BY HOUSEHOLD 10/21/2024 – 10/27/2024









