
New Water Use Restrictions from the State of California

Earlier this year, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted an emergency regulation, requiring all California residents, businesses, and public agencies to follow new water use restrictions. These restrictions only apply to potable (drinking) water and are expected to remain in place until at least January 2023. Livermore's previous outdoor watering restrictions, found on the back of this page, remain in effect.

See Wasted Water? Here's What To Do

If you spot a leak or wasted water, report it directly to Livermore Municipal Water. We will contact the property owner to let them know about the issue and offer water conservation materials.

Irrigating during or within 48 hours after receiving 0.25" or more rain.

Washing a vehicle with a hose without an automatic shut-off nozzle.

Hosing off hardscapes like sidewalks, driveways, buildings, patios, or parking lots.

Using fountains or other decorative water features (unless the water is recirculated).

Using water for street sweeping, construction uses, or irrigating turf in public medians.

How Often Can I Water?

Last September, Livermore City Council declared a Water Shortage Emergency and activated citywide restrictions on outdoor irrigation. The restrictions below remain in effect for all Livermore properties, in addition to the new State restrictions listed on the back of this page.
